


What has been happening around school?

Did you know?

Grants are available to help families on low incomes buy school uniforms and equipment.



Learners receiving free school meals can get a Welsh Government grant if they are:

- entering reception class in primary school
- at the start of any of the key stages, e.g. Key Stage 2, Key Stage 3 or Key Stage 4 (primary and secondary)
- aged 4, 7, 11 or 14 in special schools, special needs resource bases or pupil referral units.

Funding for looked after children is available in every school year.









Primary and secondary school children are entitled to £125 for each application.

Children entering Year 7 can now apply for £200 to help with the additional costs of starting secondary school.

The fund will cover school uniform and sports kit, equipment for out-of-schoolhours trips (including outdoor learning), and equipment for activities within the curriculum such as design and technology.

If you have a child starting in Reception, entering Year 3 or entering Year 7, you may be entitled to a uniform grant from the Welsh Government. Please see the information above and if you need any advice or help, please call in to the school office.





Healthy Eating Initiative As part of our Healthy Eating initiative, we have now re-introduced fruit for ALL children in the school. This is priced at 25p per day or if you wish to pay for the week in advance, it is £1. If you are paying the £1 for the week, this MUST be paid on a Monday. If you choose to pay daily, you will need to pay 25p each day. Paying on a Monday for the week makes it easier for the children who are running the fruit stall to keep a record of which children would like fruit. The children seem to be enjoying their wholemeal toast at break time. If your child hasn't had any yet but would like to, all they need to do is bring in 20p each day in order to purchase it during morning break. ***** National Book Tokens are offering schools the chance to win £5,000 for our school library. 
